26/FC6D North Somerset Council Matters
Councillor Keating reported that the request for a 20mph speed limit on Blackmoor has progressed to stage 3 on the recent North Somerset Council (NSC) Highways report.
The Local Plan is with the Planning Inspectorate for approval. If clarification is required on any part, Councillor Keating will raise this with officers at NSC.
Councillor Murray reported that a resident had raised points relating to the Local Plan and will forward the details to Councillor Keating.

26/P/0686/OU2	Bristol Airport North Side Road Felton Wrington BS48 3DY	<p>Hybrid planning application (full and outline elements) with Environmental Statement for the expansion of Bristol Airport to enable a throughput of 15 million passengers per annum, operating within a rolling 12 month cap of 99,931 air transport movements and 4,974 night flights between the hours of 23:30 and 06:00.</p> <p>Full application elements comprising: extension of western apron for additional aircraft stands; reconfiguration of central and eastern aprons; construction of a passenger surface level car park for approximately 2,000 vehicles; eastern extension of existing runway by approximately 170m, with repositioned and additional aircraft approach lighting within Felton Common; taxiway and fillet widening to Taxiway GOLF with a realignment at the western runway end; construction of two new taxiways; extension of surface level car rental parking area; expansion of existing Silver Zone car park to provide an additional circa 1,960 block parked vehicle spaces; construction of new surface level staff car park for approximately 1,720 vehicles; highway improvements to the A38, including upgrades to northern access roundabout, construction of a new southern roundabout and widening of the road to accommodate an additional bus lane with dedicated access onto the A38.</p> <p>Outline application elements comprising of 3no. extensions to terminal building on west, north and east sides; construction of new piers to the west and east of the terminal including an underground walkway; construction of ancillary support buildings; relocated and expanded aviation fuel farm; a pedestrian bridge link; erection of a new baggage building; erection of a maintenance repair and</p>
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		<p>overhaul hangar and ground run up pen; construction of parking decks within Silver Zone car park and car rental facility; minor works within Silver Zone car park; construction of a bus maintenance and washing facility; site wide landscaping, drainage, lighting and other associated infrastructure.</p> <p>The Parish Council resolved to object to this application.</p> <p>1. Introduction</p> <p>Churchill Parish Council wish to formally object to the proposed expansion of Bristol Airport to 15 million passengers per annum (mppa).</p> <p>This objection is based primarily on the fundamental geographical constraints of the site, the severe and interrelated transport limitations, and the substantial long-term public costs that would arise if the expansion were permitted.</p> <p>While local concerns understandably focus on the already heavily congested A38, it is essential that the Planning Inspectorate and Central Government take a wider, strategic perspective.</p> <p>The central issue is not simply traffic congestion in isolation, but the fundamental unsuitability of the airport's location for further expansion.</p> <hr/> <p>2. Fundamental Geographical Constraints</p> <p>Bristol Airport is uniquely constrained by its location on a small hilltop plateau.</p> <p>Despite handling over 10 mppa and ranking among the UK's largest airports, it sits on a site that is inherently unsuited to major expansion.</p> <p>Key limitations include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• A short runway, which is below typical international standards and cannot be significantly extended due to topographical constraints.• A physically constrained plateau, preventing meaningful expansion of operational infrastructure.• A divided site layout, where the runway separates the northern terminal area from the southern zone containing car parking and ancillary services.
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26/P/0935/LBC	Dinghurst Farm Dinghurst Road Churchill Winscombe BS25 5PN	Listed Building Consent for the repair and replacement of roofing including tiles, battens, timbers and felt. Replacement of valley boards, lead work, cement fillets to the chimneys and apex gable ends. Belcast drip bead to be fixed and re-rendering using waterproof sand and cement. Installation of DPC membrane beneath existing copings and eve protection trays above the fascias. Replace hard wood fascias, Re-point haunch and cap chimney pots and retention of existing guttering for future replacement. It was resolved to support this application.
26/P/0978/FUH	Timberley Bristol Road Churchill BS40 5JE	Proposal loft conversion to include dormers to the front and rear elevations. It was resolved to support this application.
26/P/0948/OUT	Land off Butts Batch, Wrington	Outline planning application with all matters reserved except for access for the erection of up to 49no dwellings including affordable housing, provision of public open space, drainage and other ancillary works. It was resolved to object to this application as per the Parish Council's previous response.

26/FC5M To receive matters for information.

Councillor Ronicle reported there had been a spate of thefts in Langford and surrounding villages. There was no Police presence when reported.

Councillor Alleyne asked if a response had been received from a letter sent to the Police Inspector in March regarding Police patrolling at school times. The clerk advised no response had been received and will follow up. Costs for a temporary pump track had been obtained and will be added to the Finance and Personnel Committee in July.

Councillor Murray advised that Sing for Fun is linking up with the Power of Music organiser for an event at St Mary's church in Langford on 19.6.26 from 1.30-2.30pm.

Councillor Comley reported that the application for funding for the Speed Limit Repeater device will be submitted on 16.6.26.

Councillor R Baker advised that the kissing gate had been removed and areas marked for the new

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footpath on Churchill Green. A resident has written to the Banwell Bypass team expressing huge concerns for farm machinery not being able to access the area.

Councillor Bush reported that the scouts have offered to help on a community task. The Councillors suggested bulb planting and the clerk will ask the BSIP team if they would donate bubs for the event.

Councillor M Baker reported that the footpaths in the area need maintenance. This is the responsibility of the landowner, however the clerk will contact Weston Ramblers to see if they can assist. The Community payback team can help when they are in the village on 20.6.26. Councillors were asked to advise of paths in need of strimming for the team to help with.

Councillor Comley suggested a standardised process for footpaths and this will be added to the next agenda.

Councillors noted the parked around the new school had improved and vehicles were parking in another area of the village.

The next Parish Council meeting will be 6th July 2026 at 7.30pm
