## Churchill and Langford Parish Council – Meeting Summary

North Somerset Councillors report

Councillor Keating reported that the request for a 20mph speed limit on Blackmoor has progressed to stage 3 on the recent North Somerset Council (NSC) Highways report.

The Local Plan is with the Planning Inspectorate for approval. If clarification is required on any part, Councillor Keating will raise this with officers at NSC. Councillor Murray reported that a resident had raised points relating to the Local Plan and will forward the details to Councillor Keating.

Councillor Keating will ask Highways at NSC when the 20mph will come into effect.

Councillor Murray feedback residents' frustrations to the work being carried out on the roundabout at Churchill lights.

Councillor Ronicle asked where the funds from fines from parking in the red zone at the airport were being used.

The Parish Council made the following reply to the BSIP consultation:

The Parish Council resolved to comment on the following:

Drivers exiting Ladymead Lane onto the A38, can the white waiting box on the A38 be changed to yellow so vehicles can flow into traffic.

Work must be completed by the end of February 2027- contractors to comply with this to prevent further disruption.

Can minibuses use the filter through lane from the A368 to A38.

Matters for information:

Councillor Ronicle reported there had been a spate of thefts in Langford and surrounding villages. There was no Police presence when reported.

Councillor Alleyne asked if a response had been received from a letter sent to the Police Inspector in March regarding Police patrolling at school times. The clerk advised no response had been received and will follow up. Costs for a temporary pump track to trial were discussed but budget does not permit this.

Councillor Murray advised that Sing for Fun is linking up with the Power of Music organiser for an event at St Mary's church in Langford on 19.6.26 from 1.30-2.30pm.

Councillor Comley reported that the application for funding for the Speed Limit Repeater device will be submitted on 16.6.26.

Councillor R Baker advised that the kissing gate had been removed and areas marked for the new footpath on Churchill Green. A resident has written to the Banwell Bypass team expressing huge concerns for farm machinery not being able to access the area.

Councillor Bush reported that the scouts have offered to help on a community task. The Councillors suggested bulb planting and the clerk will ask the BSIP team if they would donate bubs for the event.

Councillor M Baker reported that the footpaths in the area need maintenance. This is the responsibility of the landowner, however the clerk will contact Weston Ramblers to see if they can assist. The Community payback team can help when they are in the village on 20.6.26. Councillors were asked to advise of paths in need of strimming for the team to help with.

Councillor Comley suggested a standardised process for footpaths and this will be added to the next agenda. Councillors noted the parked around the new school had improved and vehicles were parking in another area of the village.

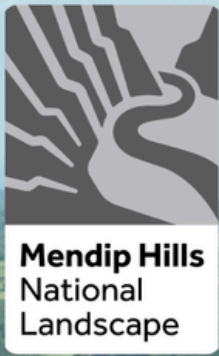

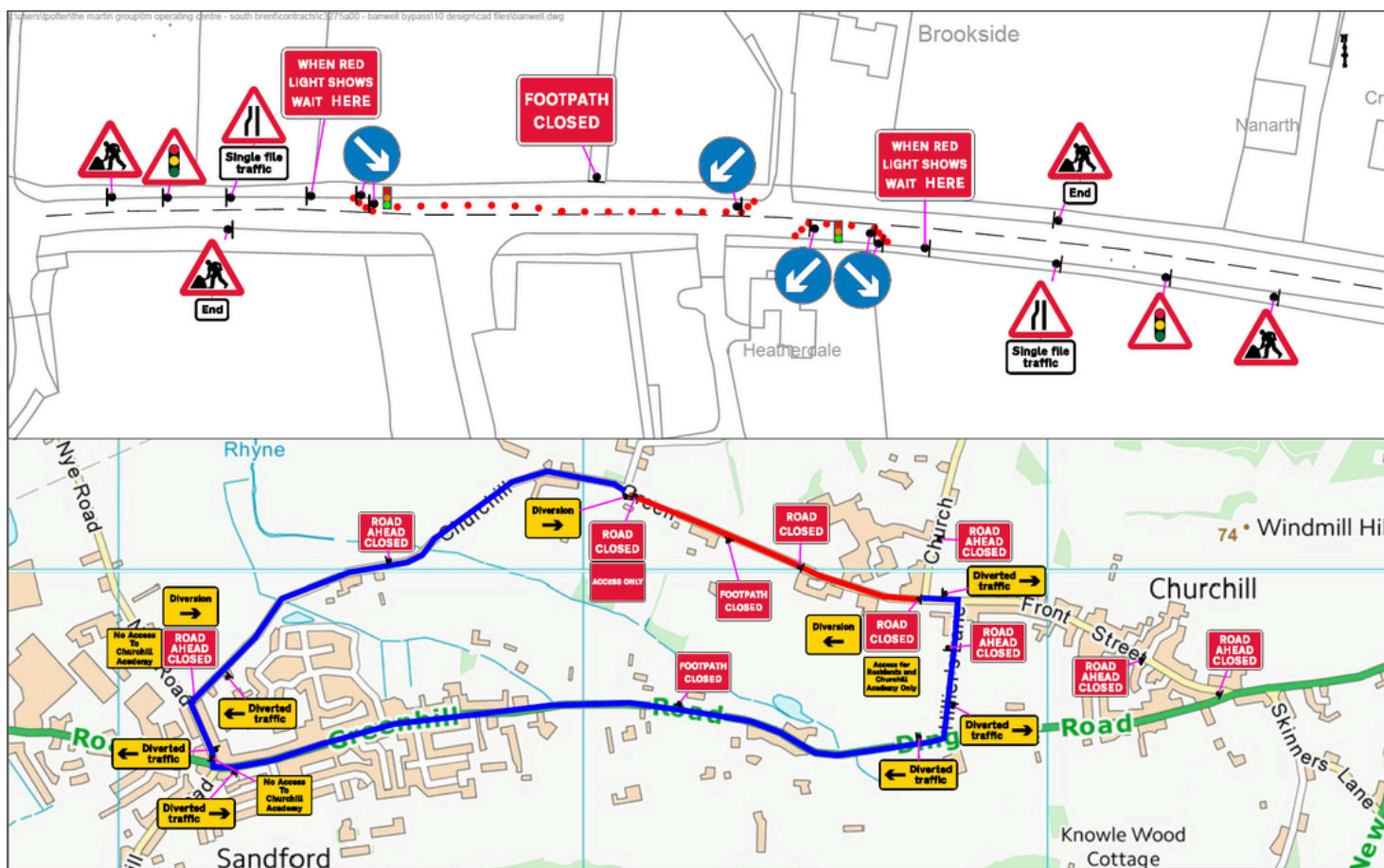
There will be full access to Churchill Academy throughout

Explore gardening topics with John Simmons

When I wrote the July column last year I had just got back from a week in Turkey, where the temperatures had been in the mid-30's. I didn't have to go to Turkey this year as we got very close to those temperatures here in Churchill. The mid-30's are almost as unpleasant here as they were in Turkey - I'm heading to Norway later in the summer, so I think I should be safe there!

Such unprecedented temperatures present a challenge to gardeners, and we are often told that we should choose our plants for hotter, drier summers. However, we do live on a rainy isle, and plants that like hot and dry in the summer normally don't like being consistently wet in winter. Who said gardening was easy?

Many of you will have come along to the National Garden Scheme opening of my garden; Church View, on Front Street in Churchill, in mid-June. I'm delighted to report that we had 250 paying visitors, contributing £1200 to the NGS. In addition, our neighbours at Barrows Patch kindly donated 20% of their takings from plant sales that weekend, and the formidable team from St John's Church donated 10% of their takings for tea and cake sales. A grand total of £1350 was donated to the NGS to support their beneficiary charities. The NGS is a fantastic charity, and if you'd like to get involved as part of the Bristol, Bath and North Somerset team then do please let me know.

July is definitely the month for enjoying your garden. Dead-head to keep things flowering and take out weeds that you've previously overlooked. If you have the joy of bindweed then keep pulling it out - you'll gradually weaken it and it will disappear, though it may take a few years for you to win. Pots will need regular watering, and weekly feeding. I've rigged up a drip irrigation system which takes out a lot of the work and saves me a huge amount of time.

In the fruit and veg beds pick courgettes before they become marrows. (This is one job I won't be doing as slugs ate all of my courgette plants 😞). Harvest whatever is ready; currants (of all colours), peas, beans, early potatoes, onions and salads should all be cropping now. Tomatoes are probably ripe or ripening and need regular watering and feeding. Keep removing side-shoots from tomato plants, unless you are growing a bushy variety. Plum and cherry trees should be pruned now, as this will avoid the fungus they are prone to if you prune them in the winter.

Remove blanket weed from the pond. You'll probably have had to do this before now, but you should rake it out or twirl it around a stick, then leave it by the side of the pond overnight so any trapped creatures can escape.

Take cuttings; penstemons, lavender and salvias are all very easy to grow this way, and many shrubs, such as philadelphus, deutzia, hydrangea and honeysuckle can also be propagated by cuttings. Click [HERE](#) for a useful how-to-do-it guide.

## Update from Tessa Munt, MP for Churchill and Langford

Hello everyone,

It's been another busy month, both here and in Westminster. I had a brilliant time at Churchill Academy, holding my first in-school lunchtime 'surgery'. It was fascinating to talk to so many young people about what matters to them, and to hear their concerns, questions and ideas. I really look forward to returning in the new academic year.

I joined Avon & Somerset Search and Rescue volunteers out on the Mendip Hills, meeting the team and learning more about their essential work across the area. Set up in 1975 principally to rescue climbers in the Cheddar and Avon Gorges, nowadays they respond to a wide range of incidents, accidents and emergencies, giving their time freely and helping those who get into difficult, and often risky, situations. They respond 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, and it's truly humbling to spend time with such well-trained, dedicated and highly motivated volunteers. ASSAR are a unique resource for our local community and their work is entirely reliant on public donations. Thank you, ASSAR, for everything you do!



In Parliament, I asked questions about the low mileage rates paid to those undertaking Jury Service, Councils losing income from recycling their aluminium, huge business rate hikes for rural micro and small businesses like The Cider Barn at Draycott, long delays to the compensation scheme for victims of the medical 'mesh' scandal, new training to increase the understanding of state threats for 'front line' health, job centre and social services staff as well as the Police, the Northern Ireland 'Troubles' Bill, and wasting NHS time and taxpayers' money providing unsuitable wheelchairs for patients.

I questioned Ministers about:

- \* the low mileage rates paid to those undertaking Jury Service
- \* Councils losing income from recycling their aluminium
- \* potential breaches of export trade regulations for waste tyres
- \* huge business rate hikes for rural micro and small businesses like The Cider Barn at Draycott
- \* when and by whom the records relating to the June 1994 Chinook air crash were sealed for 100 years
- \* long delays to the compensation scheme for victims of the medical 'mesh' scandal
- \* whether new training to increase the understanding of state threats for the Police should be extended to 'front line' health, job centre and social services staff as well
- \* the legacy of the Northern Ireland 'Troubles' Bill
- \* the habitual waste of NHS expertise, resources, time and taxpayers' money providing unsuitable wheelchairs for patients, which then have to be replaced.

## Wrighton Vale Rotary Club

### On Board the International Space Station *A talk by Jo Richardson, FRAS*

Members enjoyed a fascinating and highly engaging presentation from **Jo Richardson, FRAS**, a respected space consultant and close friend of astronaut **Tim Peake**. With striking visuals, Jo brought to life the extraordinary realities of living and working aboard the **International Space Station**.

She described the ISS as an environment of *"very close quarters"*, where astronauts must adapt not only to confined space but also to the profound physical challenges of microgravity. Jo explained the *"terrible effects on the human body of zero gravity for even short periods"*, from muscle loss to changes in bone density and balance.

The audience was particularly struck by the sheer intensity of launch: astronauts are *"accelerated from zero to 17.5 thousand mph in eight minutes"*, an experience that few humans have ever undergone. In fact, Jo reminded us that *"only 600 people have been into space"* to date — a figure that underscores how pioneering human spaceflight still is.

Looking ahead, Jo explored the big questions shaping the future of exploration. Will humans one day colonise Mars? What technologies must be developed to make longduration missions possible? And perhaps the biggest question of all: are we alone? Jo suggested that life elsewhere in the universe is almost certain, though the nearest potentially similar system is *"2.5 light years away"* — a reminder of the vastness of the cosmos.

Her talk left members inspired, curious, and full of questions about humanity's next steps beyond Earth.
